Greg Merkle opened the meeting.

Marti Taylor, CEO of One Fifteen/Verily offered an overview of their plan. It is an organization looking to reverse the Opioid crisis. The number one cause of death for those under 50 in the United states is overdose. In 2017 we lost 70,000 people. Over 350,000 deaths. We will spend over \$500 billion on this epidemic this year.

Verily is a tech company, a health-care company. At that time 115 people were dying every day. In Ohio 13 people a day. The cost of this – we could give back Montgomery County almost one billion dollars. We are spending approximately \$30,000 to \$50,000 per user in incremental health care costs, lost work and law enforcement.

The mid-west was hit hard due to being the Crossroads of America. We are partnering with people in this community.

The Mayor of Dayton put out a briefing indicating that ADAMHS and Law enforcement were working for a support system, access to treatment, Narcan and sterile syringes.

We are developing a Treatment Center with a recovery center and the wrap-around services that go with it. We are opening in the next few weeks. Kettering and Premier are partnering with us. Verily is a sister company to Google. Alexandria is our real estate partner. Greater Dayton Hospital. City Wide. Samaritan Behavioral Health is our operating partner. We are building in the Carillon Community and in the Edgemont Community. We are working with the neighbors and will have 24/7 security on campus. Verily does a lot in health care. They met with six or seven governors – the Governor recommended that if they were in Ohio they should go to Dayton. We will have approximately 150 employees. We will have management there 24/7. We will offer therapy. The Outpatient Clinic, the Fowler Building, will be provided. Our grand opening is June 14, but anyone that would like a tour is welcome. We have purchased five acres and there will be outdoor activities. The hospital has been converted to group therapy rooms. The Carillon neighborhood may use this for community activities. The front is for individual therapy rooms with the rear being used for minor medical care. Senator Portman and Senator Brown have both been supportive of this work.

Bruce asked if they plan to reach out to First Suburb communities. We are starting with Montgomery County through ADAMHS funds. Alicia Nelson was appointed to a task force to identify the top eight issues. We are working closely with them. We will be tracking outcomes

How are you going to prioritize? We are starting with outpatient and then in early August add the in-patient beds.

Does everyone in the room have equal opportunity to get there? On average there are approximately 60 people a day detoxing in the jail. We are starting with pre-trial. We have two more plots there that we could build on.

How many patients will you have when you are fully operational? About 4,000 in the course of a year.

We are starting with opioids. Our neighbors have asked about alcohol. Of the opioid deaths, 23% African American are 13% Latino.

Jack reported on the NLC First Tier Suburbs meeting to be held in Huber Heights in July. The evening at the Rose is planned for Friday, July 26<sup>th</sup>. Tentatively, the event will be open to elected officials and the CEO from each of our Member Communities plus one guest each.

Greg offered that in Vandalia, the Aullwood Nature Center did not renew their lease for the Prairie Land At the corner of Frederick and Rt. 40. The Dayton Airport is proposing developing the land. They are asking the Governor to preserve these nature centers. It is about 140 acres. It has been there for the past 50 years. They plan to take 109 acres to develop. They are concerned that this is the "headwater" and will affect other areas downstream.

Jack thanked Harrison Township for hosting this evening.

The State Audit will be tomorrow morning. It is a basic audit, costing approximately \$450 plus the cost of a legal notice stating it has been done.

We spoke about "red light" cameras. Last week there were four new bills submitted to limit these cameras. The State appears to be limiting cities authority.

Bill Lautar was inducted into the Kettering Schools Chester A. Rausch Hall of Fame.

Our next meeting is June 26<sup>th</sup> in West Carrollton. Executive Committee meeting to be June 5<sup>th</sup>.

Greg requested approval of the April minutes. Tim Gorman made a motion and Bruce Duke seconded – approved.

Greg also requested acceptance of the April Financial Report – Motion was made and seconded – approved.

Jack made us aware of his summer schedule.

Tim Gorman made a motion, Bruce Duke seconded a motion to adjourn.
